

STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS OR DISABILITIES (SEND)

ENROLMENT POLICY

All children and young people may experience learning difficulties at some point. This is not unusual. For most children, the difficulties are temporary and are soon overcome with help and encouragement from home and school.

The term 'Special Educational Needs or Disabilities' is used to describe learning difficulties or disabilities that make it harder for children to learn than most children of the same age. Children with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities (SEND) are likely to need extra or different help from that given to other children their age. This help is known as special educational provision.

As an online school, we expect our students attending our group lessons to primarily study at home on their own as independent learners. Therefore, the two classes per week are there just to support them with home-schooling.

Our online group lessons are not designed to support SEND students. Therefore, if any SEND student wants to enrol with us, we can only offer One-to-One lessons. This is to ensure each SEND Student has an individual teaching approach and receives extra or different help from that given to other children their age.

When enrolling students, if there is any indication that a student might be an SEN student, only One-to-One lessons must be offered. No promises of acceptance to the academy can be made. Acceptance is only by final approval



of the Headmaster, who is also the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Co-ordinator (SENDCo) for COA International, as stated in the General Terms and Conditions of Admission, which each parent must sign before enrolling a child to COA International.
